


Monthly Unemployment Rate, 2019 and 2020

-30% Pre-Pandemic Unemployment by Race/Ethnicity




Employment Recovery Disparity by Wage Level

2020 Federal Stimulus funds included Economic Impact Disaster Loans (EIDL) and Paycheck Protection Program

Despite targeted outreach by City staff, community and banking partners, businesses in areas where more than 75% of residents are people of color were substantially less likely to receive Federal PPP and EIDL loans in 2020. The maps below show the number of EIDL and PPP loans made in proportion to the number of businesses located in each zipcode, highlighting the areas that are majority people of color. These funds do not include the CARES Act funds distributed by the

(PPP) loans for small businesses. Oakland businesses collectively received 2,722 low-interest EIDLs and 7,405 forgivable PPP loans in 2020, prior to the reopening of PPP in 2021. About 696 businesses received PPP loans of \$250K or more, while 5,895 received less than \$100K, together totaling over \$884M in PPP loans citywide in 2020 for the first two


