### WHAT IS A CAPITAL BUDGET?

A City's **savings account** to improve & renovate **public infrastructure.** The City of Oakland plans its capital budget **every 2 years**!

> THIS PLAN IS CALLED A CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PLAN (CIP)



OakDOT CIP is organized into 12 programs, including capital projects for paving, sidewalks, signal lights, intersection improvements, community planning & others!






HISTORICALLY, CIP projects were only proposed by staff in each City department. In 2018, The City of Oakland directly requested CIP projects from COMMUNITY MEMBERS. We received almost 300 COMMUNITY REQUESTS! CITY STAFF submitted almost 300 REQUESTS as well.


#### 129 community requests focused on

transportation. **OakDOT** reviewed and classified these requests in **3 categories**:
