Dear Community,

This October, I'm proud to **celebrate Filipino American History Month** and our vibrant Filipino culture and heritage. As a daughter of Filipino immigrant health care workers, I have been blessed to be a part of our amazing community of activism and advocacy. I also appreciate all our Filipino City of Oakland workers.

In addition, I'm pleased to submit a resolution to the Council on Tuesday, October 3rd to [honor the 50th anniversary of Filipino Advocates For Justice \(FAJ\)](#) and their work for a Filipino community empowered to advance social and economic justice, as well as democratic and human rights for all. Community Safety

Community safety continues to be my top priority. I share your concerns and anger, and want you to know that your City is working hard and collaboratively for a safer Oakland. At our September 19 Council meeting, we passed a resolution prioritizing public safety. Through the focused work of our City, in collaboration with many partners, we share the following updates.

Foot patrols are back in our business districts thanks in part to a 3-year federal grant. Stronger community policing, together with violence prevention and addressing root causes, will help build a more effective safety system. At our last Grand Lake Neighbors meeting, we welcomed Ofc. Mike Cooper who is patrolling Lakeshore and Grand Avenues; and at the last Lincoln Summer Nights Mid Autumn Festival, we re-connected with Ofc. Tony Chang who is patrolling Chinatown, a beat he previously had for four years. These teams across the entire city are building relationships with businesses and neighbors in our commercial corridors to help boost community safety.

Oakland police bring back old strategy: foot patrols in commercial dis...
The city of Oakland has brought back a policing strategy that it has not used in years: foot patrols in commercial districts.



Mayor Thao and OPD announced an **expansion of the Ceasefire Strategy which led to the arrest of 10 suspected gang members** they said were connected to car jackings, armed robberies and car burglaries. Oakland's Ceasefire Strategy aims to reduce gang-related shootings and homicides, decrease incarceration rates and recidivism, and strengthen police-community relations.

A **national partnership with the U.S. Marshalls led to 137 arrests in Oakland**, including 31 individuals allegedly involved in homicides, 20 related to assault, 4 for sex offenses, 27 for robberies and 26 for weapon offenses.

At our last City Council meeting, we voted to **continue deep investments in violence prevention**, by approving \$28 million in two-year violence prevention grants for 24 community-based organizations working on: group and gang violence, gender-based violence and community healing. I'm grateful to my budget team for adding funds to our two-year budget to make this possible. Council also continued \$3.3 million in employment grants, after Mayor Thao and Public Safety Chair Rebecca Kaplan identified costs savings to continue this critical work. We heard loud and clear from youth, and adults, how important the connection to a good job is to creating more stable and safer communities. At this Tuesday's Council meeting on October 3rd, we will hear the **City Administrator's response to the Grand Jury Report on 9-1-1**. This will include an action plan and spending plan for the additional \$2.5M in **investments in our 9-1-1 staffing and infrastructure**.

Traffic Safety

This past week was an especially tragic week as four lives were lost to traffic violence. This underscores the urgency of **improving our transit infrastructure**, especially along our High Injury Network which includes International Blvd. and other streets with high levels of traffic injuries and fatalities.

Last Monday, I joined City leaders to announce **lower speed limits in 11 commercial districts** as part of California Pedestrian

Safety Month. The simple fact of the matter is, when it comes to traffic safety, speed kills. [Learn more here about lowering speed limits.](#)

I have also met with the family of Maia, a 4 year old whose life was lost after a [bike collision on Lakeshore Ave.](#) After advocating together, OakDOT has agreed to [create protected bike lanes on Lakeshore](#), as it continues to address safety in our High Injury Network.

I'm committed to working with OakDOT to implement near and long-term capital projects that equitably address traffic safety.



Finally, I **honor the legacy of Sen. Dianne Feinstein.** She paved the way for many women leaders and shaped important policy on gun control, water and LGBTQ rights. Rest in peace.

9/26: Special Council Meeting on the 2045 General Plan: Last Tuesday, Council convened for a Special Meeting to continue and conclude the matter of the [2045 General Plan Update](#), which passed unanimously. One critical amendment directs the City Administrator to create an interagency working group to implement the air quality actions in the environmental justice element, and within 6 months, bring a report back on the efforts to do such. 9/28: Rules & Legislation Committee Meeting on Public Ethics Commission Legislation: Last Thursday, I joined the Public Ethics Commission to propose two pieces of legislation: (1) [Limited Public Financing Act Of 2024](#), which would temporarily restore public financing in the 2024 election while the new Democracy Dollars Program is being developed for 2026 and (2) [Lobbyist Registration Act](#), which would codify the new registration fees, late fee caps and fee waivers. Both pieces of legislation were approved and will be heard by the City Council on October 17th.



- **Sidewalk Parking:** At the September 12, 2023 Public Works and Transportation Committee meeting, the Committee received an informational report on sidewalk parking that clarifies parking on sidewalks is illegal under federal, state and local laws; this ensures that the public right of way is available to pedestrians. This issue impacts narrow streets across the City including in District 2, where streets such as Underhills and Hillsborough have engaged with our office. This Fall, OakDOT will conduct education and engagement, and work to ensure consistency in enforcement. In November, staff will issue warning citations. **Full enforcement will resume on January 1, 2024.** Please stay tuned for Neighborhood Council meetings where OakDOT will engage to address issues, such as ensuring the passage of emergency vehicles, which require 14 feet of access according to the Fire Department.
