INFORMATION

This Informational Memorandum provides an update and details on the distribution of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) Business Assistance Fund grants.

Background

To support Oakland businesses and avoid adverse permanent impacts from BRT infrastructure changes, in 2014 the City Council created the \$2,000,000 Business Assistance and Sustainability Fund, which is currently known as the Business Assistance Fund (BAF). On July 19, 2016, the City Council approved the Eligibility Criteria and Disbursement Guidelines through Resolution No. 86321 C.M.S.

The BAF is to be distributed as follows: \$1,000,000 in Zone 1 (the area east of Lake Merritt Boulevard and west of 52nd Avenue) and \$1,000,000 in Zone 2 (the area west of Lake Merritt Boulevard and east of 52nd Avenue). On May 12, 2020, in response to the COVID-19 economic crisis, the City Council passed Resolution No. 88116 C.M.S., which enabled BRT businesses to use up to \$10,000 of BAF funds for operating costs if the business can demonstrate impacts due to COVID-19 and allowed the reallocation of funds from one zone to another should there be a lack of eligible businesses.

Following Council's modifications to the program, certified letters were sent to all known existing applicants (approximately 90 businesses) to inform them of the program changes, and to request submittal of incomplete items specific to each application to secure their funding. After additional staff follow up by phone and email, funding for Zone 1 businesses was fully committed. The Zone 2 business applications and program interest increased, but additional focused outreach was needed to reach full subscription.

On August 18, 2020, staff sent a mailing to over 350 BAF-eligible business owners in Zone 2 that had not previously submitted BAF applications. At the end of August, The Office of the City Attorney (OCA) finalized the grant form agreements for operating costs, allowing staff and program participants to execute agreements for funding.

Current Status

As anticipated, the \$10,000 operating grant revisions passed by City Council in May 2020 allowed significant progress to be made on grant execution and funding of BRT businesses. Below is the current grant status as of February 4, 2021. Since late August, 67 approvals for operating cost grants have been sent, and 58 operating cost grant agreements have been executed and funded. The last approximately \$150,000 of uncommitted funds is expected to be fully committed through executed grant agreements prior to August 2021, when the program expires.

As a result of the additional outreach in Zone 2, all funds for the BAF were initially committed by early October. Waitlists were established for both Zone 1 and 2, with the waitlist order determined by the date of receipt of a complete application.

On October 2, 2020, staff mailed letters to 15 BAF applicants with existing commitments for construction projects, reminding them of the next steps to proceed with their projects, and providing them until October 23, 2020 to provide any remaining missing documentation. As staff

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pressed for application completions, not all of the applicants wished to proceed with their construction projects, and as a result, some funding in Zone 2 was freed up, allowing for applicants on the waitlist in Zone 2 to be funded. As of the current date, a waitlist remains for Zone 1 and funds are still available in Zone 2.

In an effort to close out the program, on January 28, 2021, staff mailed certified letters to all known incomplete applications for operating cost grants in Zone 2, providing a deadline of March 1, 2021 to complete their applications, with staff available to assist in additional languages as needed. Since Resolution No. 88116 C.M.S allows the reallocation of funds from one sub-district to another, after March 1, all BAF funds will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis to business owners along the BRT corridor regardless of the zone their business is located in. The list of known applicants with incomplete operating cost grant applications in Zone 2 who received the January mailing is included as *Attachment A*, and a sample letter is included as *Attachment B*.

At this time, the amount of funding available in your zone (Zone 2 - the area west of Lake Merritt Boulevard and east of 52nd Avenue) is sufficient to fund all existing incomplete applications in your zone, so your application will be funded if you submit the required documents by the March 1st deadline.

After March 1, all BAF funds will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis to business owners along the BRT corridor regardless of the zone their business is located in. Given there is already a waitlist for funding in the other zone (Zone 1 - the area east of Lake Merritt Boulevard and west of 52nd Avenue), any remaining funds after March 1 are likely to be quickly exhausted.
