PROPOSED AGENDA

I. Implementation Update on State Grants

The City of Oakland received three state grants in 2020-2021 to support its cannabis equity program: in the spring of 2020 the City received a grant of approximately \$1,650,000 from the Bureau of Cannabis Control (BCC); in the summer of 2020 the City received a \$6,576,705 grant from the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (Go-Biz) (Go-Biz 1 Grant); then in the summer of 2021 the City received a \$2,434,712.51 from Go-Biz (Go-Biz 2 Grant). The City has disbursed all of the BCC grants funds and all but approximately \$200,000 of the Go-Biz 1 and Go-Biz 2 grants, which consist of second installments of workforce development and shared-use manufacturing grants.

In April 2022 the City of Oakland received a three-year \$9,905,020 Local Jurisdiction Assistance Grant from the Department of Cannabis Control (DCC) to support the transition of cannabis operators from a provisional to an annual state license. In June the City received the latest one-year grant from Go-Biz to support the City's Equity Program in an amount of \$5,435,140.82 (Go-Biz 3). Finally, this spring the City Council approved adjustments to a three-year grant from the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) to address the impacts of cannabis legalization.

- a. To date the City has provided \$2,896,000 in funding for 88 grants to 50 unique grantees for an average of \$57,926 per grantee. In addition, the City has received grant requests totaling a potential of \$2.2 million in additional new grant funding once underwriting and closing is complete.

a. To date, the City has lent \$4,398,239 to fund 110 loans provided to 64 unique borrowers for an average of \$68,722 per borrower. In addition, the City has received 20 requests totaling a potential of \$870,000 in additional new loan funding once underwriting and closing is complete.

III. Program Updates

We propose the following increases in grant funding:

- a. Increase the grant tier amounts to match the loan tier amount, equating to an increase of \$60,000 to grant recipients that qualify for the maximum amount
- b. Introduce a new Specialty Grant of \$15,000 to help entrepreneurs transition from provisional to state licenses
- c. Introduce a new Specialty Educational Grant of \$5,000 to those who complete the requirements discussed further below.
- d. No increase in loan tiers for the next six months, to be reassessed based on funding demand

IV. New \$15,000 grant to help transition from provisional to state annual license

The criteria to receive this grant includes:

- Provide evidence that one has a provisional state license
- Provide evidence that one has applied for an annual state license

Provide a "Scope of Work' and budget the summarizes what one needs to do
to obtain a state annual license and how the \$15,000 will help achieve that.
 Contact the state to get feedback on what the next steps are.

V. New \$5,000 educational grant

Elevate is now partnering with Oaksterdam University to provide technical assistance to loan and grant recipients. Oaksterdam provides a core curriculum called the "Business of Cannabis" which is a self-paced course including 19 classes or approximately 38 hours of work. If you complete this curriculum, pass the quizzes/tests and turn in the certificate to Elevate Impact, you can receive a \$5,000 educational grant. If you have already taken the course, we will work with you to customize equivalent curriculum materials so that you can receive the \$5,000 educational grant.
