### I. Go-Biz 3 All Funds Have Been Dispersed

- 1. The City has dispersed all of last year's grant from the Governor's Office of Business and Economic Development (Go-Biz 3) for loans and grants to equity applicants to cover start-up and ongoing expenses (such as inventory and marketing costs).
- 2. As a result, no basic grants are available via Elevate Impact until the City receives the Go-Biz 4 grant. Our office anticipates the City will receive the Go-Biz 4 grant in May, as the City Council has to first approve receipt of the Go-Biz 4 grant in April.
  - i. Please note that the total amount of the Go-Biz 4 grant is only \$1,996,487.50, as the State of California budgeted less funding for cannabis equity programs last year, and Elevate Impact already has over \$1 million in grant and loan applications in the funding pipeline.

# II. Get Your Annual State License Grants Available and Amount Increased to \$50k - Paula

1. While Go-Biz funds are not currently available, the City has available funding from the <u>Local Jurisdiction Assistance Grant</u> (LJAG). Accordingly, our office encourages equity applicants with a provisional state license to apply for the <u>Get Your Annual State License Grant</u>, which is now up to \$50,000 per equity applicant.

- 2. Eligible costs under the Get Your Annual State License Grant include:
  - i. Capital Improvements
  - ii. Architects, Engineers, and Environmental Consultants
  - iii. Regulatory Compliance, Metrc, POS systems
  - iv. CEQA Compliance and fees
  - v. Rent and Insurance

Please note that security enhancements should be funded by the security grant discussed in the next section.
