Event Description:

The Deeply Rooted in Oakland Partnership conducted English outreach at the Community Dinner & Neighborhood Resource Fair. The Community Dinner & Neighborhood Resource Fair is organized by the Black Cultural Zone. This event is an opportunity for community members to network and build relationships, which can help strengthen the community as a whole. The event welcomed residents of all ages.

The team shared an informational flyer on the Oakland General Plan; a 2-pager on housing and environmental justice conditions impacting Oakland residents; and resources for Emergency Rapid Assistance Program (ERAP), library, and maintenance. The 2-pager on housing and environmental justice conditions presented racial displacement, housing affordability, pollution burden, past and future housing production in Oakland, and a call to action. Deeply Rooted Collaborative outreach team members referred community members to direct service organizations or City Department to address their current needs and gathered questions regarding the General Plan and City services.

1) Approach people to have a conversation rather than extracting information from them 2) Share and connect residents to City of Oakland resources.
