How will OakDOT select Paint the Town projects? Community members must meet the following criteria and submit all application materials:

Budget and Fundraising Plan	Applicant should show how they plan to raise funds to paint the street mural. Applicant does not need funds secured before application submittal.	Form C C1: Budget: Expenses and Revenue Table C2: Written Explanation			
Outreach Plan	Applicant should demonstrate how they plan to build neighborhood support around the proposal.	Form D: D1: Description of outreach plan			

Please Note:

- There is no fee associated with this application. OakDOT staff will review all complete applications received.
- If the application is chosen, the applicant is responsible for installation costs, including paint, supplies, and street closure permits (see Form C1).

Design Conditions

- Only within the driving area, not curb, gutters or sidewalks
- End at least two feet before the curb, if no gutter is present and must not touch the gutter
- At least 10' from existing markings, such as crosswalks and lane lines.
- Cannot be confused with or function as a crosswalk, cannot be similar in shape to, or allude to a painted crosswalk, and must avoid mural edges parallel to the street edge
- Cannot include traffic control images
- Cannot include text that may be confused with traffic control such as "SLOW".
 Text used more abstractly is fine.
- Cannot include promotional, advertisement, or branding imagery
