- <u>Profanity, yelling, or screaming is not permitted.</u>
- <u>All remarks or questions shall be directed through the Board Chair.</u>

Community Policing Advisory Board




Responsibility:

Board members are citywide advocates for block, neighborhood, and community empowerment. They encourage and support collaborative problem solving through community engagement and partnerships. The board also oversees, monitors, and provides recommendations to the Mayor, City Council, City Administrator, and Chief of Police on the implementation of Oakland's community engagement policy, resolution 79235.

Vacancies: Four (4) vacant positions. All board positions are voluntary.

Time commitment: Varies - Board meetings are approximately 2-3 hours, on the first Wednesday of the month. Committee meetings are approximately 1-2 hours per month.



Term length: Three (3) year terms. Appointments are limited to two (2) consecutive terms.
