

Caltrans Vision 980 Study, Phase 1

The California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) will provide an informational update on the Vision 980 Study. This study focuses on addressing the negative impacts of the I-980 freeway, particularly in West Oakland, and aims to revitalize the corridor while reconnecting neighborhoods that were divided by the freeway's construction. As part of the Vision 980 Study, Caltrans explored three potential scenarios for the corridor and gathered community input to ensure the project reflects local priorities. Caltrans introduced the Vision 980 Study to the Oakland Planning Commission on [November 6, 2024](#). During this update to the Planning Commission, Caltrans will present key findings and recommendations from Phase 1 of the study and introduce the goals and next steps for Phase 2.
