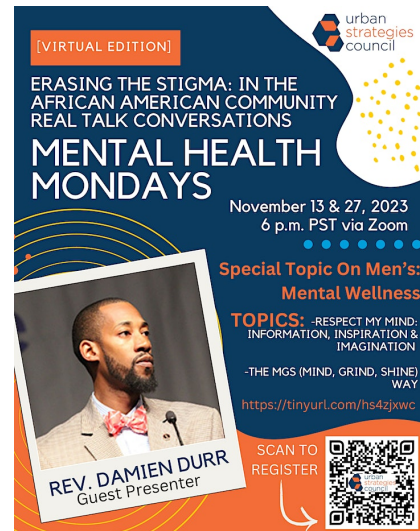

Healing Gun Violence in LatinX Communities: A Culturally Relevant Approach

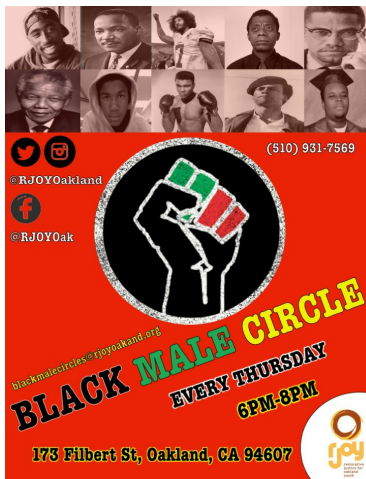
