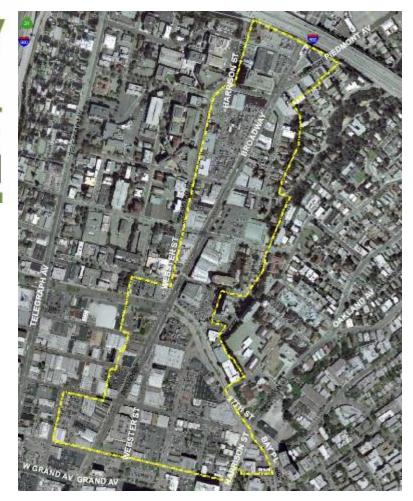
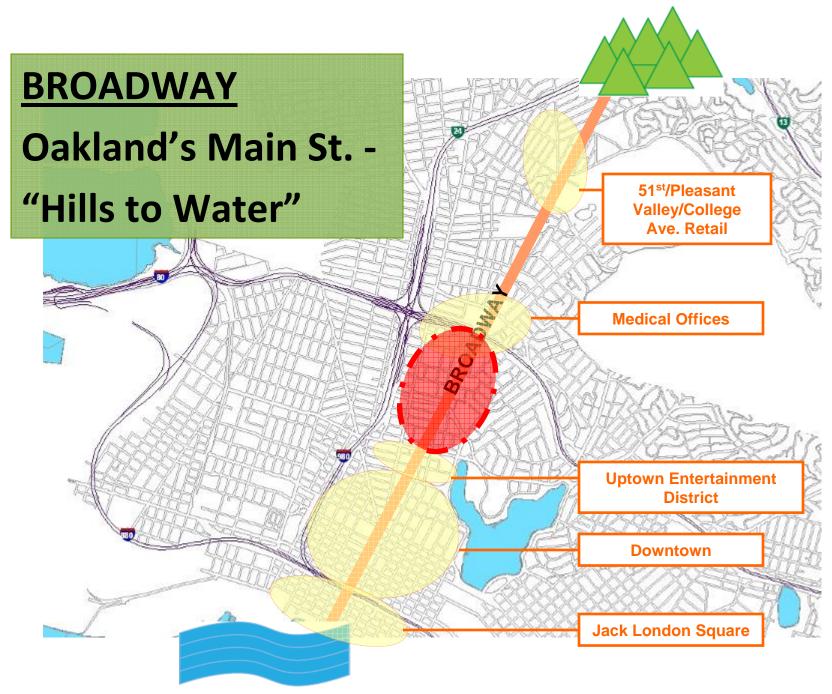
BROADWAY VALUE OF THE PLAN BROAD SPECIFIC PLAN

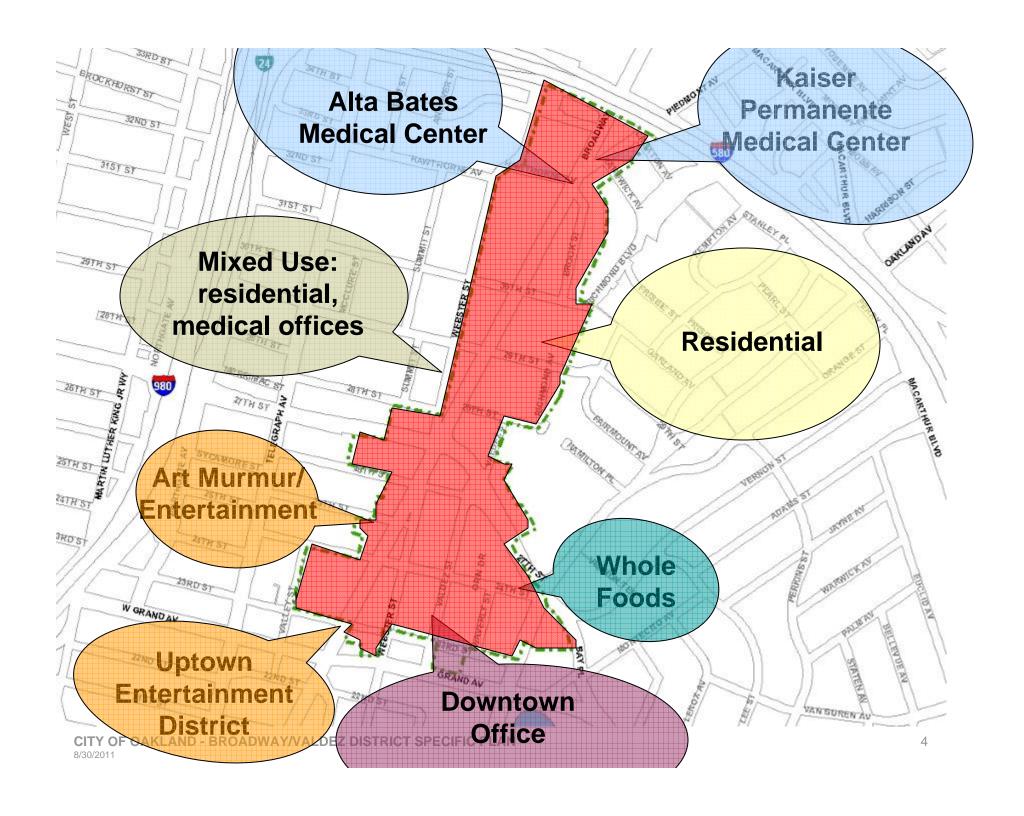

Draft Plan Goals

- A destination retail pedestrian district
- A "complete" and compact mixed-use neighborhood
- Adaptive reuse of historic buildings
- New "green" development that complements neighboring uses





Draft Plan Goals (cont'd)



- "Complete streets"
- Carefully managed parking

 A safe and attractive system of streets, parks, and civic spaces



Challenges

- Redevelopment funding extremely limited
- Many different land owners
- Small parcel sizes
- High land prices
- Redevelopment Agency doesn't control most of land in Plan Area
- Poor economic climate
- Retail industry in flux

Short-term Strategies

"Set the table" to spur development for long-term vision

- Build on what is working in the area
- "Fill-in" the gaps/activate the "dead-spots"
- Focus on making area <u>safe</u>, <u>fun</u> and <u>active</u>
- Enhance connectivity

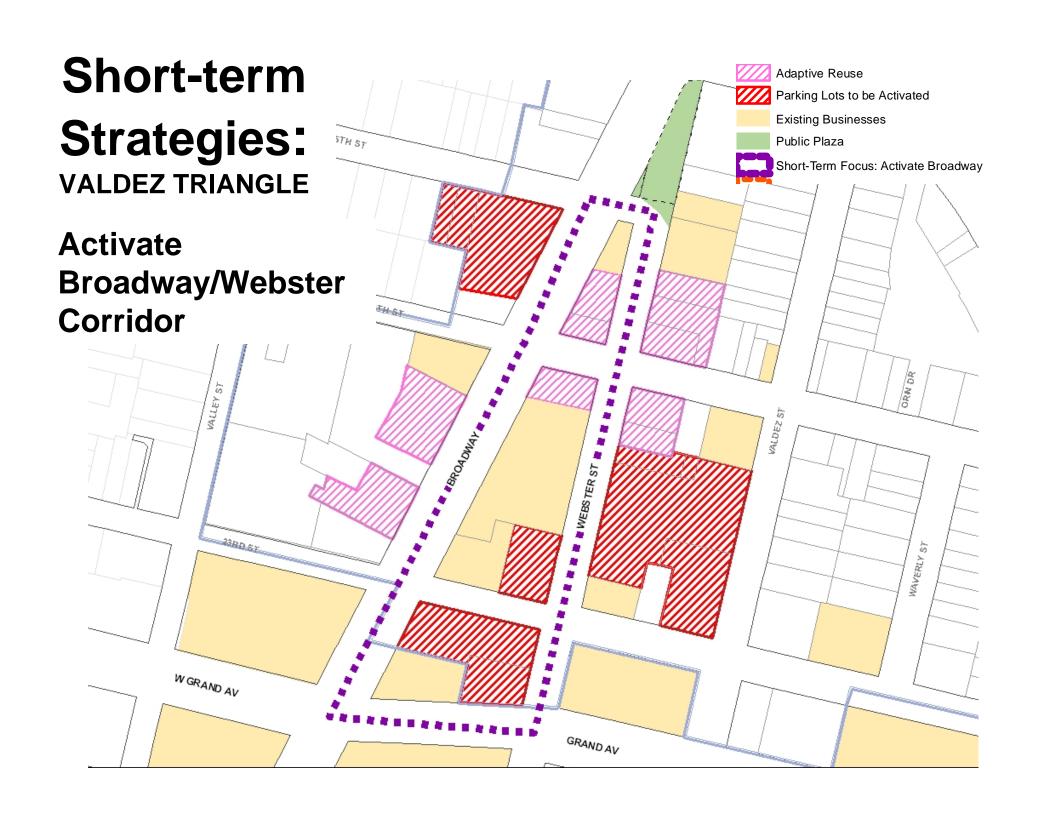

Short-term Strategies: VALDEZ TRIANGLE

- Create regulations to encourage restaurants, bars and entertainment
- Encourage art events, mobile food and retail
- Attract additional entertainment-related businesses
- Activate Broadway between Grand and 27th
- Coordinate with other efforts to activate adjacent section of Broadway (19th to Grand)

- Work with Downtown BIDs
- Facade Improvement Program
- Storefront Art Program
- Temporary Pop-Up Stores
- Murals on blank walls

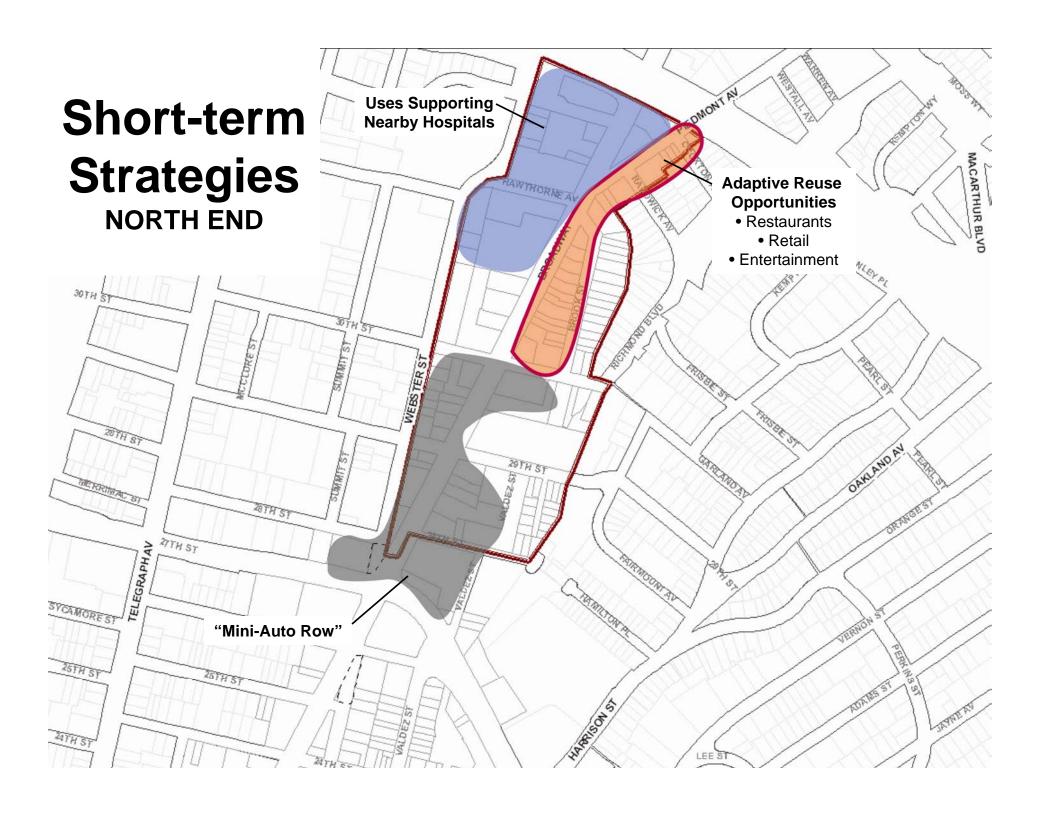
Short-term Strategies: VALDEZ TRIANGLE

- Lighting improvements
- Improve the 25th Street plaza
- Landscaping, trees
- Bike lanes







Short-term Strategies: NORTH END

- Encourage art events, restaurants and mobile food
- Landscaping, trees
- Bike lanes
- Enhance connectivity to area hospitals
- Improve Broadway and Piedmont underpasses

 Prioritize life safety code requirements; flexibility on others







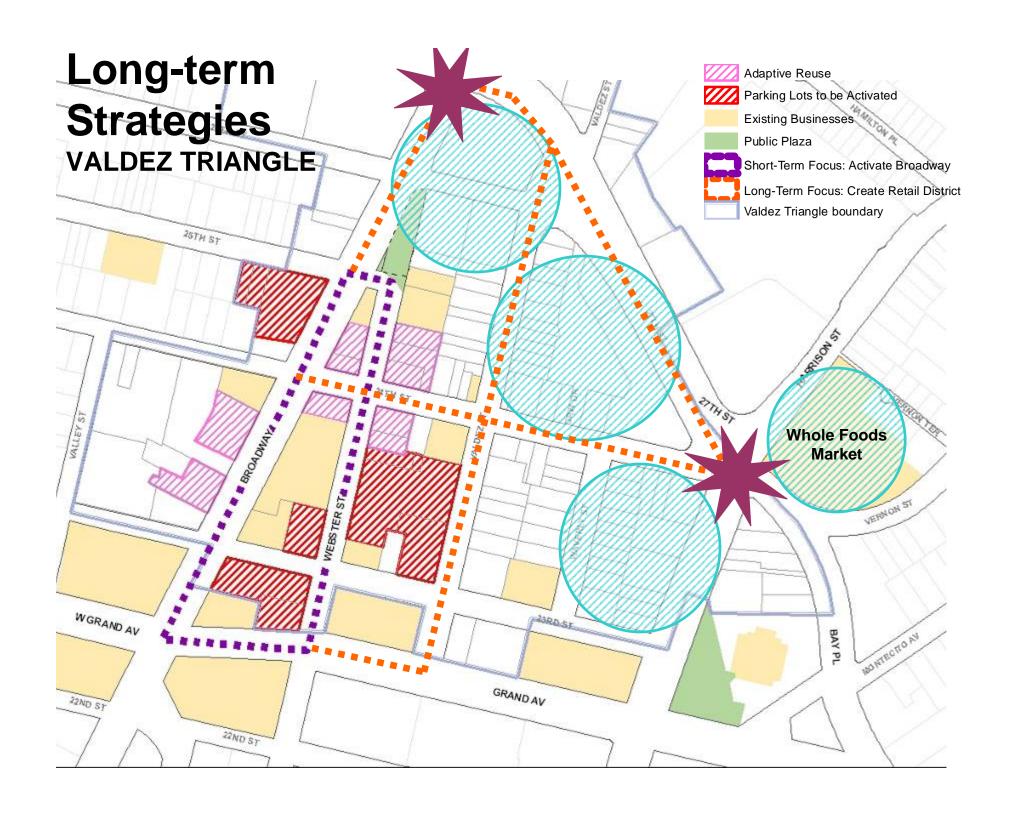
Mid- and Long-term Strategies ENTIRE DISTRICT

Strategic Public Investment:

What public investment would provide the "biggest bang for the buck" to spur desired development in the Broadway Valdez District?

Such as:

- Targeted streetscape improvements
- Mixed-use parking garage
- Develop strategy for auto businesses in area



Long-term Plan Elements VALDEZ TRIANGLE

- Large retail opportunity sites
- Streetscape improvements, public plazas
- Activate:
 - 24th St. between Whole Foods and Broadway
 - Valdez St. between Grand Ave. and 27th St.
- Parking
- Transit



Long-term Plan Elements NORTH END

- Flexible regulations
 - Housing and/or office above retail
 - Large retail opportunity sites
- Streetscape improvements
- Open Space
 - Greenway along Glen Echo Creek
- Parking
- Transit
