This informational memo for May 2024 is used to share pertinent, real-time information with the Oakland Children's Initiative Oversight Commission (CIOC).

This will be the final Accountability Officer (AO) Report for the 2023 - 2024 fiscal year, it is with pleasure to share updates and accomplishments of our collective work since we last met March 2024.

OAKLAND CHILDREN'S INITIATIVE – ADMINISTRATIVE OVERVIEW

As we continue to propel the Initiative forward, the office is diligently establishing foundational supports and strategically cultivating intentional partnerships and infrastructure. Our focus remains on making aligned and sustainable investments aligned to the 5-Year Guidelines. Please know the active support and engagement of the Commission remain pivotal in this endeavor and am enthusiastic about further strengthening these intentional connections over time.

OUSD Kaiser Playground – A significant part of the Jan – June 2023 OCI investment, OUSD celebrated a ribbon-cutting ceremony for families on Friday, May 3, 2024. It was a heartwarming culmination of our initial investments.

Oakland Promise 2024 Awards Ceremony – On Thursday, May 16, 2024 OP held their 9th Annual Awards Ceremony celebrating graduates and scholarship recipients. OCI supported investments in FY2023 – 2024 for scholarships. There were 1500 student applicants, awarding nearly \$5M to 1100 Oakland Scholars.



• 2-Year Evaluation RFP

- The American Institutes for Research (AIR) and RDA Consulting were confirmed by City Council on 4/30/24, with contract development currently underway.
- CIOC will engage with the evaluation firm at the July Commission meeting to support the development of evaluation tools.

Core Areas of Evaluation

- Economic Impact Analysis \$ Value Add
- Evaluation of Implementation includes Implementation Partners (IP) & Overall implementation structure of OCI
- Inform next iteration of 5-Year Guidelines
- Enhance existing practices & Results Based Accountability metrics

Initial Draft Timeline

- May Sept 2024 Evaluation Kick-off, Planning & Design
- Oct Dec 2024 Data Collection Tools Developed; Initial (existing) data collection & review.
- Program Plans, Budgets, & Reports Implementation Partners have submitted initial drafts of their program plans, currently under review. IP's are also refining their reporting structures, with updates provided at each CIOC meeting.
- Communications Finalizing Videos 2 and 3, focusing on each fund and Implementation Partner. Video 4, wrapping up our first year, is currently in progress. Plans for FY24/25 communications are also being discussed.










