The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed the staff report was prepared and presented by Dana Riley and Carlos Vargas from Oakland Parks, Recreation and Youth Development (OPRYD).

Staff presented the design options for the Project Backboard sponsored gift-in-place for resurfacing the worn and cracked basketball court at FM Smith Recreation. Community engagement opportunities for the public to view and comment on the proposed court designs was held on May 1 and scheduled again for May 22, 2019 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. GoDaddy, Project Backboard's partner, issued a press release and social media announcements for the design review opportunities. While eleven (11) individuals attended the May 1st meeting, the Commission suggested staff and organizers contact the Chair of the local NCPC – Neighbor Crime Prevention Council to possibly increase community engagement.

Improvements to the site includes cleaning, patching, resurfacing and striping the exterior basketball courts and applications of colorful graphic design created by Alicia McCarthy. The community will be invited to help with painting.

The project is expected to be completed in June 2019.

E. The Department Of Transportation And Department Of Public Works ADA
Program Division Request That The Park And Recreation Advisory Commission
Review And Provide Comment On The Proposed Adaptive Bike Share Pilot
Program Locations At Snow Park, Lakeside Park, And The Bay Trail.

The Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission reviewed the staff report was presented by Kerby Olsen from the Department of Transportation (DOT).

In response to a 2016 grievance regarding accessibility to the City of Oakland's bike sharing program, GoBike, the Department of Transportation (DOT), Department of Public Works and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Program Division, convened a technical advisory committee to study determine best practices for providing more accessible services to persons with disabilities. The proposed adaptive bike share pilot program is the result of over a year of collaboration between the three agencies, in addition to the Metropolitan Transportation Commission.

The proposed 6-month pilot program would operate from various locations Wednesdays and Saturdays from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., beginning in late May 2019.

Locations for staging operations have yet to be finalized, but may include Snow Park, Lakeside Park and the Bay Trails near Jack London Square. Each service location will feature a pop-up tent and up to eight bikes.

The pilot program will be operated by Bay Area Outreach and Recreation Program (BORP). Based in Berkeley, BORP's Adaptive Cycling Center is the most active adaptive cycling program in the nation. Participants in the pilot program will have the opportunity to ride or learn about handcycles, recumbent trikes and adaptive tandems during the hours of operation.

The Commission clarified or confirmed that:

- New riders or individuals requiring bike and safety lessons will be referred to BORP in Berkeley.
- Safety helmets will be provided.
- Staff will consider adapting the use of bike safety flags to alert pedestrians and motorists of low riding cycles.
- Membership pricing strategies will be reviewed. BORP members will be allowed to use their membership with Oakland's adaptive program. It was proposed that low income individuals may pay \$55.00 per year in membership fees.
- Cycling equipment is low tech with no tracking devises. Riding time limits will be established. If needed one of two team members will be deployed to locate a rider.
- It is the City's intent to establish a long-term program. Various models around the country are being reviewed.

Director Williams introduced returning OPRYD staff member Donte Watson. Mr. Watson was a Recreation Supervisor when last employed by the City of Oakland. He has returned to assumed the position of the department's second General Recreation Supervisor.

• Homeless Encampments briefing by Joe DeVries, Office of the City Administrator
The Office of the City Administrator convened a homeless encampment team
approximately two years ago to address the issues and concerns regarding this growing
population. The team is staffed by several City departments including: Oakland Parks,
Recreation and Youth Development (OPRYD), Oakland Police Department (OPD),
Oakland Fire Department (OFD), Vector Control, and the Department of
Transportation (DOT).

Staff informed the Commission of the City's departure from a single pronged encampment closure policy to a multi-pronged encampment management policy including:

o Observation of each site to determine need

- o Removal of trash and garbage as is manageable and safe for staff
- Management of the human waste element
- Clean and Clear Policy: Use closure noticing policy with added permission for occupants to return after the site has been cleared and deep cleaned.
- Closure Policy: Use closure noticing policy with no option to return. Clear and deep clean the site.

Also:

- Encampments have proven to attract illegal dumping. The team deploys staff to remove as much debris as possible without closing the site.
- Where encampments intersect park property on which scheduled events have been permitted by park staff, the encampment team will clear the location if sufficient notice is received.

SUMMARY

Oakland Parks, Recreation & Youth Development received a request from the East Bay Front Runners and Walkers, a non-profit organization, that is affiliated with Road Runners Club of America, a nationwide organization that provides advice, support and liability insurance for recreational running clubs. East Bay Front Runner and Walkers is requesting approval to collect on-site registration fees and sales of limited merchandise during the 5K and 10K Pride Run/Walk, proceeds raised from the event will be donated to several local non-profit organizations after expenses. Approval from the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission is required per O.M.C. section 12.64.080.

The Pride Run/Walk is timed, and prizes are awarded to the winners in various categories.

Dear Commissioners:

East Bay Front Runners and Walkers is a group of lesbians, gay men, bisexuals, transgenders, and friends who enjoy exercising outdoors. The club holds a run/walk every Saturday morning at a scenic location in the East Bay, including Lake Merritt, the Emeryville-Berkeley shoreline, and Bay Farm Island. The Saturday morning run/walks are non-competitive and very informal; participants simply meet at the announced location and then run or walk together.

Since 2005, the club has held an annual Pride Run/Walk consisting of 5K and 10K loops around Lake Merritt to encourage healthy recreation, particularly among those who are interested in a competitive event. The Pride Run/Walk is timed, and the winners in various categories are recognized. All participants receive simple refreshments (muffins, bagels, fruit, and juice) and a pair of EBFRW socks bearing the club's initials. At a couple of the past events, informational booths have been set up by a local chiropractor or a gym, but they have sold no goods.

Net proceeds from the Pride Run/Walk event have been donated to several local nonprofit organizations, and we plan to continue doing this in future years. The club has endeavored to turn over all event proceeds after expenses to recipient organizations. (Ordinary club expenses are supported by annual membership dues and not by the Pride Run event.) The most recent Pride Run event, held in October 2018, generated a total of \$3,500 that was divided among:

Pacific Center in Berkeley, which provides professional counseling and advocacy to enhance the well-being and self-respect of lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender individuals.

Oakland LGBTQ Community Center, dedicated to enhancing and sustaining the well-being

of Oakland's LGBTQ individuals, families, and allies.

Oakland Gay Men's Chorus, a 40 to 50 voice choral group that performs a wide variety of music each year in concert and in numerous church, community, and outreach performances.

Recipient organizations have not yet been determined for 2019.

The number of participants has varied from year to year. In 2018, 158 persons registered for the event. Most runners and walkers typically pre-register using the club's website (www.eastbayfrontrunners.org). Participants are encouraged to pre-register; advance registration has been \$25, while same-day registration was \$30. At the event in 2018, all but twelve participants preregistered.

In 2019, the East Bay Front Runners and Walkers club hopes to expand the reach of its annual Pride Run/Walk, both in the number of participants and in the funds raised for donation to worthy organizations. To assist in meeting this goal, the club requests permission to accept registration fees on race day at the event in Lakeside Park on October 12, 2019. Pre-registration will continue to be encouraged. We anticipate that most participants will pre-register, but having the ability to accept on-site registration enhances the event's appeal and increases the number of participants. We hope to reach a goal of approximately 180 registrants in 2019, with fees to be collected on-site amounting to perhaps \$500 at most.

In 2019, no on-site donations will be solicited, although if offered, any donations to EBFRW to support the event would be gladly accepted. No sale of food items will take place. We do request permission to sell one merchandise item on-site. The EBFRW club produces socks bearing the club's initials, and one pair of socks is given to each participant in the run/walk. We request permission to sell additional pairs of socks to any participants who might want them (in prior years we have sold just a handful of pairs of socks at Pride Run/Walk events; no socks were sold in 2018). Socks would be sold approximately at cost (about \$7 per pair), not as a fund-raising measure but simply as a convenience to participants.

East Bay Front Runners and Walkers is a nonprofit organization with 501(c)(3) status and is affiliated with Road Runners Club of America (www.rrea.org), a nationwide organization that provides advice, support, and liability insurance for recreational running clubs. Liability insurance for East Bay Front Runners and Walkers' Pride Run/Walks is supplied through RRCA.

COMMISSION TO PROVIDE A RECOMMENDATION TO THE CITY OF OAKLAND PLANNING COMMISSION FOR APPROVAL OF A MAJOR VARIANCE FOR ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE SALES IN THE EXISTING CONCESSION STANDS AND CAFÉS/RESTAURANTS AT THE OAKLAND

ZOO.

SUMMARY

Beer and wine sales are proposed to be located within five existing concession stands and cafés/restaurants at the Oakland Zoo, including: Tusker's Restaurant, Children's Zoo Concession Stand, Safari Café, Giraffe Ridge Concession Stand, and the Landing Café. Exhibit A provides an overview of all five locations as well as the associated floor plans of each establishment. Alcoholic beverages will be sold at these locations during normal hours of operation, which are Monday to Friday from 10:00am to 4:00pm and Saturday to Sunday from 10:00am to 4:30pm.

Planning Staff requests the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission provide a recommendation of approval to the City of Oakland Planning Commission for a Major Variance for Alcoholic Beverage Sales at the Oakland Zoo as described above.

FISCAL IMPACT

There are no foreseen negative fiscal impacts by adding the sale of beer and wine to the Oakland Zoo. The Zoo will work with vendors, such as Service Systems Associates (SSA), to provide inventory based off demand. In addition, the City of Oakland is expected to generate additional tax revenue from the additional sales of beer and wine.

PROJECT / PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Oakland Zoo is proposing to sell beer and wine in five existing café's/restaurants and concession stands during hours of operation. The sale of these products will be accessory to food sales. Exhibit B provides information on food items that are currently available at each location. Alcohol sales will

be available to adults of legal drinking age, who could either consume the beverages within the seating areas available in the café's/restaurants or carry the beverages within the zoo boundary. The Oakland Zoo currently has security and medical staff, which will be available during regular zoo operating hours for assistance if needed for alcohol related incidents. Exhibit C is a Statement of Operations for Alcohol Sales at the Oakland Zoo, which describes the extent of the operation, including hours, employees, and security.

The Zoo is also proposing to sell beer, wine, and spirits during special events, such as fundraisers, charities, and corporate events. These events will occur after normal operating hours, and the sale of alcoholic beverages will occur from portable carts. The Oakland Zoo will work with departments, such as the Oakland Police Department's Alcoholic Beverage Action Team (ABAT), California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), and the City Administrator's Office and Oakland Police Department, to obtain special event permits for each event. This aspect of the project is not included in the request for the Major Variance.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

The Oakland Zoo is located within the Open Space (Special Use Park)/OS (SU) Zoning designation. Per Planning Code Section 17.11.010, "The OS Zone is intended to create, preserve, and enhance land for permanent open space to meet the active and passive recreational needs of Oakland residents and to promote park uses which are compatible with surrounding land uses and the city's natural environment."

The proposed alcohol sales require the granting of a Variance, because it is not permitted in the subject zone. The OS (SU) Zone only allows Alcoholic Beverage Sales Commercial Activity as part of a General Food Sales Commercial Activity. Section 17.10.270 of the Planning Code describes General Food Sales Commercial Activity as follows:

General Food Sales Commercial Activities include the retail sales of food or beverages for off-site preparation and consumption. This classification includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- A. Supermarkets or grocery stores that that offer a variety of food items for home consumption such as a combination of fresh fruits, vegetables, breads, meat, dairy products, cereals, pastas, and prepackaged foods. Generally, grocery stores are a minimum five thousand (5,000) square feet and have a minimum twenty percent (20%) of net retail floor area devoted to the display of fresh fruits and vegetables and/or fresh meats, whichever is greater.
- B. Stores specializing in particular or distinctive food items, including but not limited to, retailers whose primary business maintains an inventory of specialty, gourmet, health, or ethnic food items. Examples of activities in this classification include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - Gourmet food stores;
 - Bakeries:
 - Butchers;
 - Specialty food stores;
 - Fish and poultry shops;
 - Produce markets;

- Delicatessens (may include sandwich shops in conjunction with the sale of other delicatessen products);
- Health food stores.

The proposal by the Oakland Zoo is not permitted because the beer and wine would be sold from a combination of concession stands, restaurants, and cafés, which are not considered General Food Sales Commercial Activities. Furthermore, the Variance is considered Major, and thus requires a decision by the Planning Commission. The reason for this is because Section 17.148.020(A) of the Planning Code states that "A 'Major Variance' is a Variance which involves...Allowable activity or facility types."

Prior Zoning action at the Oakland Zoo include the 2011 amendments to the Oakland Zoo Master Plan, which pertained mainly to the zoo expansion area, aerial gondola, new Veterinary Medical Hospital, perimeter fencing, overnight camping area, and creek protection. Any changes or expansions of the existing concession stands or cafés/restaurants to accommodate alcohol sales will be reviewed by the Planning Department per the appropriate regulations and guidelines. No changes to the stands or restaurants are included in this proposal.

RECOMMENDATION

Planning Staff requests that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission provide a recommendation of approval to the Planning Commission for a Major Variance for Alcoholic Beverage Sales at the Oakland Zoo. Staff believes the proposal will not have an impact on the surrounding neighborhood or the Zoo, due to the availability of existing and proposed security and medical staff. The availability of beer and wine will provide additional beverage options for visitors and increase the City's sales tax revenue.

Proposed Use: The sale of beer and wine at five existing food concession locations within the Zoo on a daily basis:

Landing Café
Tusker's Grille
Children's Zoo Concession Stand
Safari Café
Giraffe Ridge Concessions

In addition, the sales of beer, wine and spirits at special events such as fundraisers or corporate receptions at various locations throughout the Zoo via temporary dispensing stands. Patrons would be allowed to carry beverages within the zoo boundaries, but not in parking lot areas.

Normal Zoo Hours of operation:

Monday - Friday: 10:00am to 4:00 pm Saturday & Sunday: 10:00am to 4:30 pm

Special Event Hours: All special events will end by no later than 11:00 p.m.

Number of employees: 50+

Number of Security Personnel: There are 15 security employees. There is one or more security guards on duty 24 hours/day every day. During hours that visitors are at the Zoo, there is a minimum of (1) Chief or Assistant Director, (1) supervisor, (1) EMT, (1) security officers. Dear Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission,

I am the Artistic Director of Topsy Turvy Queer Circus (www.topsyturvycircus.org), the Nation's foremost queer Circus performance company. Topsy-Turvy Queer Circus originates and stages multidisciplinary productions that amalgamate queer culture and circus art forms and challenge and subvert traditional ideals of gender, sexuality and power. Our productions turn traditional representations of beauty and strength upside-down by presenting visual images deeply rooted in queer experiences.

For the past 6 years we have staged an annual large-scale multidisciplinary performance at the Brava Theater in San Francisco, as well as smaller events throughout the Bay Area. This year we are organizing a new performance showcase, called the Festival of Infinite Imagination to take place on August 17th, 2019 at the Bandstand and surrounding area at Lake Merritt.

The event will feature the work of 6 Black queer and trans performing artists, all creating work around the central question: 'What does your radical and expansive imagination have to offer the Black past, present and or future'. Each of the 6 artists will present a 15 -30 minute performance piece. The performances will include music, dance, theater, video projection, lighting, installation and performance art and we will be using amplified sound. The event will run from 4pm -8pm, with a 6am set up time and a 9pm strike.

We are estimating 400 attendees including performers and crew. We ask permission to sell tickets at the event by way of a sliding scale suggested donation. We understand that our event will be taking place at a public park without fencing and that there will be general public present in addition to our guests, and don't expect everyone to give a donation.

We also plan to have catered food at the event and ask permission to collect donations/payment for food. Food sales will go directly to the caterer. Additionally we request to have a merch table set up where we will sell festival merchandise such as T-shirts and cassettes.

The money we receive via ticket donations will go directly towards paying the performing artists, and production costs associated with the event. We will continue to serve our target audience, the SF Bay Area's 350,000LGBTQ+ residents. Our past event surveys find that over

75% of our audience self-identifies as LGBTQ+ and over 40% identified as Queer and Trans People of Color (QTPOC.) The Festival of Infinite Black Imagination will attract our usual LGBTQ+/QTPOC audiences, the families, friends, relatives and neighbors of the participating artists as well as the Bay Area's established and emerging circus artists, aerialists, dancers, choreographers and performing artists.

Our past three showcases have been fully ASL interpreted and we are working to ensure accessibility to as many of our community members as possible. Jess Curtis Gravity Dance Access Services will provide live audio description services for Blind and Visually Impaired people.



For The Concordia And Patterson Park Mini-Pitch Soccer Renovation Valued In An Amount Not To Exceed One

Hundred Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$120,000)

SUMMARY

The Oakland Parks, Recreation and Youth Development Department (OPRYD) received a project commitment from United States Soccer Federation Foundation, Inc. (Foundation), a non-profit corporation, to provide in-kind services for the renovation of the exterior tennis court in Concordia Park located at 2901 64th Avenue and one exterior tennis court in William "Bill" Patterson Park located at 9175 Edes Avenue.

The project involves up to \$120,000 of in-kind services to convert an underutilized tennis court at each location to a soccer "mini-pitch" including a new acrylic surface, game lines, tamper proof soccer goals, a windscreen with design from a local artist, and heritage signage to commemorate the history of the location.

In acknowledgement of the gift and commitment to the City of Oakland, the Foundation and Target Corporation, the donors supporting the project, will be recognized through placement of medallion logos on the court surface along with the OPRYD logo.

FISCAL IMPACT

This report has no negative impact to the City and completes unfunded deferred maintenance. The City will execute a one dollar (\$1.00) gift-in-place contract with vendors selected by Foundation to perform the work. The selected vendors shall provide insurance and bonds as required by law, and the contract shall be approved for form and legality by the Office of the City Attorney. Through the gift-in-place contract, Foundation shall assume all responsibility in regards to compensation to the selected vendors for the work performed to complete the Concordia Park and Patterson Park exterior court mini-pitch soccer renovation project.

PROJECT / PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Staff wishes to leverage public and private resources wherever feasible to improve city parks and neighborhoods. The Concordia Park and Patterson Park courts were chosen by the Foundation because of the value it will provide to the local community.

Poor surface condition, sagging nets, and torn or missing windscreens make play on the Concordia court unenjoyable. While the Patterson court surface is in fair condition, there is heavy community use of the courts for soccer. Installing proper boundary lines, goals and nets on one court will enhance the experience for players. The work to the courts will consist of surface preparation including crack filling and leveling, application of a new acrylic surface atop the current space, painting lines for soccer use, installation of tamper proof soccer goals, and the addition of a fence at Patterson Park to divide the space from the remaining tennis court. Target Corporation's community focus is facilitated by the Foundation in creating unique additions to each mini-pitch site. The project includes a windscreen with design by a local artist and a heritage sign to commemorate the history of each space with photos and text. Both windscreen design and heritage sign will be brought to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) for review and the windscreen design will be reviewed by the Public Arts Advisory Committee.

Renovation work by the Foundation will extend the useful life of the courts and is expected to increase positive use of the area by creating a community hub. In surveying communities across the country where a mini-pitch exists, findings are the following:

- 100% say that soccer-specific programming has increased
- 97% say that people in the community are more active
- 91% say that the mini-pitch serves as a community gathering place
- 78% say that the community feels safer
- 32% of mini-pitch users are brand new to soccer
- User demographics:
 - o 61% Hispanic
 - o 19% African-American
 - o 11% Caucasian
 - o 9% Other
 - 77% Qualify for Free and Reduced Lunch Program

During engagement with the OPRYD Sports Advisory Committee consisting of citywide community based sports organizations, local youth, a survey of nearby schools, and with assistance from City Councilmember Taylor and Reid the courts at Concordia and William "Bill" Patterson parks were determined suitable for the mini-pitch improvement to increase healthy recreational opportunities in the local community. It was identified that the Concordia tennis court received very little use and while the courts at Patterson Park receive a moderate amount of daytime tennis use, evening use is predominately for tot soccer.

The Foundation's *Soccer for Success* program is an after-school program, offered free to participants, that is proven to help kids establish healthy habits and develop critical life skills through trained coach-mentors and family engagement. More than 150 organizations run 1,700 *Soccer for Success* sites across the country, and the goal with every mini-pitch is to match the location to a program partner in the area or form a partnership with the landowner for this proven program. OPRYD is collaborating with Foundation to facilitate the Soccer for Success program and preliminary discussion with schools located near the parks has been met with enthusiasm.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Several City courts were visited and considered before the funder selected Concordia and Patterson parks for the project. The parks were selected based upon recommendations from the OPRYD Sports Coordinator's analysis of pairing community interest in soccer with spaces that are not being used due to their poor physical condition or lack of community interest in its current purpose. The need for resurfacing of courts across the city exceeds available funding, and the private donation activates spaces that would otherwise sit unused.

The Foundation developed what is called "mini-pitch" soccer for communities where space is at a premium. The small, customized hard-court spaces perfectly suited for organized soccer programs and pick-up games provide quality playing surfaces for children and adults. They also transform the look and feel of neighborhoods. The Foundation believes soccer can be the difference between a child who grows up to change the world, inspired by a coach-mentor and encouraged by the community, or one who falls through the cracks. The Foundation's Mini-Pitch Initiative aims to install 1,000 new soccer play spaces by 2026 in areas where children don't have as much access to amenities such as recreational facilities and playgrounds that are abundant in suburban communities.

Serving the role of project manager with preferred vendor relationships, the Foundation forms public-private partnerships to facilitate mini-pitch projects. Larger partnerships in New York and Chicago are in progress, each installing 50 mini-pitches over five years. In 2017, Target committed to funding 100 mini-pitches over three years. Since that time, the Foundation has partnered with entities in Houston, Dallas, Chicago, Atlanta, Tampa, Orlando, Miami, and Phoenix to install almost 40 new mini-pitch projects in communities.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission recommend acceptance of a gift of in-kind services from the United States Soccer Federation Foundation, Inc. for the Concordia and Patterson park mini-pitch soccer renovation valued in an amount not to exceed one hundred twenty thousand dollars (\$120,000).

SUMMARY

The Oakland Parks, Recreation and Youth Development Department (OPRYD) received a request from the Brooklyn Basin project sponsor Zarsion Oakland Harbor Partners I, LLC (ZOHP), to name the four parks at the development. The Park Name—Land Plan (*Attachment A*) illustrates the parks and location within the project. The first park, Township Commons, is anticipated to open in July, 2019. The proposed park names and the background on each name follows.

Township Commons: The name was chosen in honor of the Brooklyn Township, established in 1856 at the site of today's Brooklyn Basin development. The notion of the commons means land or resources belonging to the community as a whole. The park is a representation of a community asset, a grand civic space designed to accommodate large celebrations, impromptu gatherings, or day to day activities.

Brooklyn Plaza: The name was also chosen in honor of Brooklyn Township. The park is envisioned as a plaza that connects visitors to retail shops and the Clinton Basin waterfront.

Mayhew Park: Named for Brooklyn Township's first and only mayor, elected and re-elected three times before the township incorporated into the city of Oakland.

Sii Tka Park: The Ohlone translation of "Sii Tka" is "Into the water". The naming of the park was proposed by the Sogorea Te Land Trust and is pronounced *Seed-Kah*.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact to the City of Oakland in naming of the parks at the Brooklyn Basin project.

PROJECT / PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The 29.9 acres of new open space are planned along the waterfront edges of Brooklyn Basin. In total, they are a diverse network of parks, promenades, and plazas along the Estuary shoreline, linked by a pedestrian and bicycle trail system that connects to Jack London Square and Oakland's eastern waterfront. The open space includes 4 new parks, an expanded Estuary Park, and a wide public promenade along the perimeter of Clinton Basin. Each of the new parks within Brooklyn Basin plays a specific inter-related and complementary role. Township Commons, part of the first phase of Brooklyn Basin, is scheduled to open in late summer 2019. Located at the far eastern end of Brooklyn Basin, it is the park most closely tied to the industrial heritage of the site. Township Commons features repurposed truss structures from the 9th Avenue Terminal building and a large south facing deck. Brooklyn Plaza provides a predominantly hardscape plaza that can host civic events at the head of Clinton Basin and connects to wide promenades; Mayhew Park is a quiet meadow planted to promote pollinators and featuring long views up and down the Estuary; Sii Tka Park features a viewing hill with vegetated edges for passive recreation and big water views. On the westernmost side of the area, Estuary Park features open fields for recreation and is closely tied to the Jack London Aquatic Center and the small-boat sailing, kayaking, rowing and other aquatic programs that are offered there. All the parks and open spaces are linked with pedestrian and bicycle trails along the water's edge, contributing a total of 1.6 miles of new Bay Trail.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Brooklyn Basin development project encompasses a 64 acre site that adjoins the Oakland Estuary to the south, the Embarcadero and the I-880 freeway to the north, 9th Avenue to the east, and Fallon Street to the west. The project includes 29.9 acres of City parks located along the Oakland-Alameda Estuary edge of the Brooklyn Basin site. The Brooklyn Basin Project was approved by the City of Oakland Planning Commission on March 15, 2006, a Development Agreement was executed on July 18, 2006, and final entitlements were granted in 2009. The project sponsor, ZOHP plan to construct up to 3,100 residential units, 200,000 square feet of ground-floor commercial space, a minimum of 3,950 parking spaces, and 29.9 acres of parks and public open space. Final Development Plans for the parks was approved in August 2017 by the City of Oakland.

City policy to name a public facility is set forth in Resolution No. 65024 C.M.S. (Attachment B), and requires that all requests for naming of parks and recreation facilities be referred to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (PRAC) and the Rules & Legislation Committee before the name is recommended to the City Council. Resolution No. 65024 C.M.S. states criteria for appropriate naming that includes a) a geographical area of the City or a significant historical event, b) an individual philanthropist, family, or estate name, and c) unique or civic circumstances. The PRAC reviewed and recommended approval of the naming request at the June 12, 2019 meeting.

The proposed park names were vetted with and recommended by Councilmember Nikki Fortunato Bas. Based on the Councilmember's recommendation, all names were reviewed by the Sogorea Te Land Trust. Educational signs and learning boards placed in the parks will explain the background of the park name bringing awareness to the history of the area and the Ohlone people.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Parks And Recreation Advisory Commission recommend to the City Council to adopt a resolution naming four (4) parks at the Brooklyn Basin Development Township Commons, Brooklyn Plaza, Mayhew Park, And Sii Tka Park.

WHEREAS, the City Council Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee of the City of Oakland has conducted a review of the procedure by which the City Council selects appropriate names for municipal facilities in the City of Oakland, other than Parks and Recreation facilities; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has directed that an official procedure be established for designating official names for public facilities in the City of Oakland; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED: That the City Council herewith approves and adopts the following procedure for naming public facilities in the City of Oakland:

- Any individual or entity may initiate a proposal to name or rename a public facility in the City of Oakland.
- All requests for naming and renaming public facilities in the City of Oakland shall be transmitted to the Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee, including requests by:
 - (a) individuals and public officials;
 - (b) clubs, civic groups, or neighborhood organizations;
 - (c) public agencies or governmental entities.
- 3. Any request to name or rename park and recreation facilities shall be referred to, or may be initiated by, the Oakland Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission (OPRAC). The recommendation of the OPRAC shall be referred to the Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee.
- 4. The Rules and Procedures/Legislative Committee shall review all requests and recommend an appropriate name to the City Council. Special consideration will be rendered based upon the following criteria:
 - (a) a geographical area of the City or a significant historical event:
 - (b) an individual philanthropist, family, or estate name;
 - (c) unique or civic circumstances;

- (d) memorialization of a living person, only under special circumstances as follows:
 - the honoree contributed half or more of the cost of a major facility;
 - the honoree initiated or contributed major time to the establishment of the project;
 - overwhelming belief (public opinion) that the designee would probably be honored for that facility posthumously;
 - if no other individual now living has, or is likely to have, greater public support for being honored at this specific site;
 - the honoree has given extraordinary service to the City or the community;
 - o the honoree has attained national or international prominence and achievement.

Upon approval, the City shall limit its recognition of an honoree to one facility or portion thereof. Further, facilities named for a specific individual should rarely be renamed, although the City Council could be flexible in renaming facilities originally named for geographical areas, etc. A public hearing shall be conducted by the City Council prior to the official designation of any name for a public facility.

In Loving Memory of Our Father and Grandfather MOHSEN PAKZAD 1915 – 2008 No Boundary In Kindness and Love

FISCAL IMPACT

Donation of \$1600 (\$800 per plaque) will be made to the Oakland Parks and Recreation Foundation to have the plaques purchased and installed. The plaque installation process is in accordance with the Oakland Public Works Department construction requirements. The donor will assist with maintaining the plaque by washing the plaque every few months with soft cloth, water and a mild dishwashing liquid.

BACKGROUND / LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Fakhri and Mohsen Pakzad immigrated from Iran in 1977. They lived in Irvine California until their passing. Mr. Pakzad worked for the Iranian government, then under SHAH's rule, for 40 years. His last job was chief accountant of Iran's Plan Organization that is responsible for the nation's development. Mrs. Pakzad was a housewife and helped raise five children with her husband. All the children are U.S. citizens and are successful educators or businessmen.

Fara Pakzad is the third sibling and is now 75 years old. He received his education at University of California (UC) Berkeley and is now a retired businessman. His wife taught at UC Berkeley for the for over 30 years and retired last year. They live in Upper Rockridge in Oakland and have two sons and three grandchildren who also live in Oakland.

The family walks around the lake often; Fara Pakzad walks every day. With Fara Pakzad's parents buried in Southern California, and the family not being able to go to their graveside, having memorial benches in Oakland close to the family is a real gift. Whenever they are at Lake Merritt, they would be able to pay their respect to their parents and grandparents.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Parks and Recreation Advisory Commission recommend approval of the two plaque languages as written for dedication of two benches in memory of Fakhri and Mohsen Pakzad.
