Cost Per Collected Ton Rate Element. Proposers should provide a proposed cost per Collected Ton representing the total **dollar amount** the proposer anticipates Recyclable Materials Collection to cost. This shall include all costs of providing Recyclable Materials Collection Services including, but not limited to, Collection, Processing, Disposal of Recycling Residuals, and franchise fee costs.

Projected Tonnage Cap Rate Element. Proposers should provide projections for the total maximum Collected Tons for the period beginning July 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015, and the period beginning January 1, 2016 through December 31, 2016.



- 2. Bonds on behalf of contractors in connection with bids, proposals or contracts.

The foregoing powers granted by the Corporation shall be subject to and conditional upon the written direction of any officer (or any designee of any such officer) to execute and deliver any such bonds.

The disclosure requirement applies to pending disputes on other City and Agency contracts or projects that: (1) have resulted in a claim or lawsuit against the City of Oakland (2) could result in a new claim or new lawsuit against the City of Oakland or (3) could result in a cross-complaint or any other action to make the City of Oakland a party to an existing lawsuit. "Claim" includes, but is not limited to, a pending administrative claim or a claim or demand for additional compensation.

Contractor shall provide proof that health benefits are in effect for those employees no later than 30 days after execution of the contract or receipt of City financial assistance.
- (c) To inform employees that he or she may be eligible for Earned Income Credit (EIC) and shall provide forms to apply for advance EIC payments to eligible employees.
