Existing Conditions & Need

Regional & National Significance

- 65 trains a day use this corridor, moving freight and passenger rail throughout the U.S.
- The one-mile rail and roadway segment along Embarcadero West accounts for 25% of vehicle incidents along Amtrak's 160-mile segment from San Jose to Auburn









Existing Conditions & Need


Local Significance 2014 – 2023

- 47 injuries from reported collisions
 - **11** Pedestrian
 - **7** Bicyclist
 - **27** Driver

2017 - 2023

- 390 reported 'vehicle on track' incidents
- **67** in 2023 alone

Embarcadero West: Market St - Oak St



1860s-era shared roadway and rail design is not:

- meeting current rail safety standards
- accessible for people with disabilities
- a welcoming connection to the waterfront






Project Goals & Opportunity

Project Goals

- Significantly increase railroad crossing safety for all users on Embarcadero West
- Improve reliability for freight and passenger rail operations
- Enhance access and connections to the Jack London District and Waterfront

Project Scope









Overweight Corridor

Existing Conditions

2021 – Present Overweight trucks instructed to bypass Adeline Street overpass (*Adeline Bridge*).


Temporary re-route through residential West Oakland on 7th Street until bridge retrofitted or rebuilt.

Goal

Create near-term route to remove overweight trucks from 7th Street sooner than bridge redevelopment

Proposed

- Rebuild railroad track crossing on Port property to overweight truck standards.
- Establish new temporary overweight route to remain emergency access when bridge is redeveloped. Not intended for public access.



Note

Overweight or Heavyweight trucks:

- 80k 95k lbs
- Require permits
- Must use designated overweight routes







Existing Conditions

Majority of rail incidents occur when vehicles make left turns over tracks

Goal

Reduce opportunities for incidents while maintaining waterfront and business access

Proposed

- Reduction of vehicle traffic on E.W.
- Restricted vehicle turns
- Conversion of vehicle lanes to pedestrian and bike routes











- Shared street on northside
- 2 Bollards to slow and direct vehicles
- Westbound vehicles: right turn only
- Wider sidewalks

- Waterfront vehicle access: direct
- 6 Additional lighting
- RR gate arms for vehicles and pedestrians
- Bike lanes and walking path on south side








- Shared Street
- 2 Fencing between intersections
- 3 Track asphalt replaced with gravel between intersections
- A Railroad operating width maintained

- 6 Additional lighting
- **6** 2-way bike lanes
- Walking path
- Landscaping where feasible

Rail Safety and Access Bike Network Connections

Embarcadero West will provide a protected bike lane segment of the **Green Loop**

Loading and parking needs from **Webster St** to **Oak St** under study for potential protected bike lane connection









Urban Design

Goal

Select design elements and materials that:

- Enhance placemaking a people-centric specific sense of place in the Jack London District
- Are ADA accessible usable by wide ranging abilities
- Provide safety and comfort between modes
- Support wayfinding and directions
- Are appropriate for short and long term maintenance
