


2nd Street Transit Hub – Proposed Line 12 Reroute

Why reroute off Embarcadero West?

- Line 12 crosses the railroad tracks leading to delays.
- Line 12 stops on Embarcadero West, forcing cars to wait and encourages unsafe travel on the train tracks.

Why not use 2nd Street?

 2nd Street is very narrow! Buses need 11 ft in each direction.
