




ABOUT THE PROJECT

OakDOT has Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) Cycle 9 funding to install safety improvements along Foothill Blvd between Harrington and Cole Streets. See the map on the following page for improvement locations. Project work includes:


- Curb bulb-outs
- Pedestrian median refuge islands
- Crosswalk enhancements
- New street signage
- Refreshed roadway striping
- Rectangular rapid flashing beacons (RRFBs)
- Speed cushions

Foothill Boulevard Improvements:

- Harrington Avenue - Median refuge island, RRFB
- 45th Avenue - Median refuge island, RRFB
- 46th Avenue - Median refuge island, RRFB
- 50th Avenue - Bulb-outs on West crosswalk
- 51st Avenue - Bulb-outs on West crosswalk
- Congress Avenue - Median refuge island
- Cole Street - Bulb-outs at NW, NE, and SW corners




EXAMPLES OF PROPOSED ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS



RECTANGULAR RAPID FLASHING BEACON (RRFB)

RRFBs are button-activated traffic safety devices that rapidly flash bright white lights to alert drivers to the presence of pedestrians. RRFBs help improve traffic safety in areas with high speed vehicle traffic, or where there are higher numbers of pedestrians or other people not traveling by car. RRFB's will be installed at Parker Avenue, 84th Avenue, between Alvingroom Court and 88th Avenue, and 94th Avenue.
