COMMUNITY STREETSCAPE PROJECT OPEN HOUSE

On October 12, 2023, the Major Projects Division hosted its first Open House for the Broadway Streetscape Improvements, Martin Luther King Jr. Way Streetscape Improvements, and the 7th Street Connection Project:

Total attendees: 75

67 Oakland residents and community members8 Community Advisory Committee members

- 58% of attendees reside in 94607 and 94608
- 31% of attendees were 65+
- 67% of attendees who reported their gender selfidentified as male
- 42% of attendees who reported their race selfidentified Black/African American
- 88% reported their primary language as **English**
- **43%** use a **personal car** as their primary mode of transportation





COMMUNITY STREETSCAPE PROJECT OPEN HOUSE:Feedback for the Broadway Streetscape Improvements

Pedestrians:

- Better pedestrian connection between Uptown, Downtown, Jack London and Waterfront Oakland
- Excitement around intersection improvements for pedestrians to improve, especially bulb-outs and lights
- Concerns around underpass safety for pedestrians, including requests for clean-up and lighting

Transit:

- Request for clarity around use of bus-only lane while emergency vehicles are passing
- Challenging the use of a bus-only lane on Broadway when more people drive than use bus
- Request for additional transit considerations beyond buses ex. space for common ride transportation

Vehicle/Trucks:

- Disappointment around removal of car lane on busy Broadway street, concerns about traffic and back ups
- Requests for removal of cars parts of downtown (Old Oakland, parts of Broadway)
- Emphasis on less car-focused planning and more focus on alternative modes of transportation

Urban Greening:

• Request for more trees, tree plots and pocket forests

Bikes:

- Requests for bike lanes to be incorporated into the Broadway plan
- Biking on Broadway is dangerous, protected bike lanes needed
- Request for more clarity around how the bus only lane will impact cyclists on Broadway

Traffic Safety:

- Support for better traffic safety in Broadway underpass, especially with freeway onramp/tunnel
- request for concrete curb on left side of bus lane to avoid cars turning right out of turn

Public Art and Culture:

- Concern about traffic backup deterring visitors to downtown businesses and gathering areas
- Lighting and cleanliness important for building downtown culture
- Underpass art should be replaced

Other:

• Better signage and wayfinding at intersections, especially Broadway underpass and 6th street



COMMUNITY STREETSCAPE PROJECT OPEN HOUSE:Feedback for the MLK Jr. Way Streetscape Improvements

Bikes:

- High number of love and support for protected bike lanes
- Request for bikes be removed from 2nd 7th Streets and/or moved to Castro or Washington Streets
- Preference for the roadway level cycle tracks
- Request for protected or left turn restrictions to prevent vehicle contact with bikes in the cycle track
- Request for bollards or vertical detection

Pedestrians:

Request for wider sidewalks and pedestrian islands

Transit:

Request for free transportation (B-shuttle, cable car, etc)

Traffic Safety:

High number of love and support for road diet

Vehicle/Trucks:

- Concern for truck volume and impact on overall project from 2nd - 5th Streets
- Stakeholders split on lack of parking vs substantial parking (particularly 2nd-5th Streets)

Urban Greening:

- High support of urban greening the area
- Request for more urban greening, trees, and plants

Other:

- Question of maintenance and street sweeping
- Concern for road diet effects on emergency vehicles



COMMUNITY STREETSCAPE PROJECT OPEN HOUSE: Feedback for the 7th Street Connection Project

Bikes:

- Excited for protected and separated lanes
- Green loop and connecting West Oakland, Downtown Oakland, and Uptown
- Increase lane width

Pedestrians:

- Request to extend the median and shorten distance to cross
- Happy for restriping and attention to overall pedestrian safety

Transit:

- Request for transit only lane
- Would like to see improvements in transit overall

Vehicle/Trucks:

- Request for a lot of residential parking on 7th and MLK
- Appreciates focus is not on cars or parking

Traffic Safety:

Request to reduce travel lanes to decrease speeding

Urban Greening:

- Request for more trees and tree plots
- Request for the raised platforms to be permeable space for low maintenance plants

Public Art and Culture:

• Creative idea for a muralist to paint the bike lanes

Other:

Re-pavement needed
