Linda Ave Bikeway Project (Piedmont Ave to Rose Ave)

DESCRIPTION

The City of Oakland is striping a new bikeway on Linda Ave, Piedmont Ave to Rose Ave. The project will be funded by Oakland's share of Measure B, Alameda County's half-cent transportation sales tax, using the 5% of revenues dedicated solely to bicyclist and pedestrian projects and programs.

The bikeway project is recommended in the City's Bicycle Master Plan (BMP). The BMP calls for the installation of bikeways throughout

Oakland to encourage bicycling as a healthy, non-polluting and affordable transportation option, helping Oakland achieve City Council-adopted sustainability and livability goals.

GEOGRAPHIC CONTEXT

The **Linda Ave Bikeway Project** will construct a 0.2-mile/three-block section of the City's bikeway network. The new bikeway will intersect with bike lanes on Piedmont Ave constructed in 2014, and extend to the City of Piedmont border at Rose Ave, where a bikeway is planned for future implementation by the City of Piedmont. See Project Area Map, below/left.

FEASIBILITY & SAFETY

The project will install both bike lanes and shared roadway bicycle markings, aka "sharrows." The road is not wide enough for bike lanes in both directions. Thus bike lanes will be installed on one side of the roadway to support cyclists traveling more slowly in the uphill direction: eastbound from Glen Ave to Rose Ave and westbound from Glen Ave to Piedmont Ave. In the downhill direction, sharrows will be installed

in the center of the travel lane. Sharrows encourage bic to clea "do and mo to bic the No spa ren part of this project.








Linda Ave Bikeway Project

SHARED ROADWAY BICYCLE MARKING (AKA "SHARROW")

Sharrows encourage bicyclists to ride clear of the "door zone," and advise motorists to expect bicyclists in the travel lane.
