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MEETING AGENDA

- A. Roll Call and Determination of Quorum
Present: Sage, Walker, Grant, Harvey, Millhouse & City Administrator Staff
- B. Approval of the Draft Minutes from the CRC Meeting on September 4, 2025
Moved by Member Harvey, second by VC Walker passes unanimously
- C. Introduction of new Commission Ahshatae Millhouse
- D. Reports for Discussion and Possible Action
 1. Nominations and vote on new Chair and Vice Chair – *Commissioner Grant nominates VC Walker for Chair no other nominations took place. VC Walker assumes position of Chair for the CRC. Nominations for Vice Chair are opened. Commissioner Harvey nominates Commissioner Sage, Commissioner Sage nominates Commissioner Grant, Grant seconds nomination for Sage. Sage abstains, Harvey Aye, Millhouse Aye, Grant Aye, Walker abstains. Commissioner Sage is appointed to Vice Chair of the CRC.*
 2. Special Meetings & Subcommittee items – *Chair Walker open to suggest motions for forming subcommittees, administrative staff contributed guidelines for subcommittees stating that ad hoc committees may convene on items of importance to the commission but must disband within 90 days and shall not consist of more than 5 members of the CRC. A report of the ad hoc subcommittees’ findings will be presented to the CRC. Chair Walker posed deciding what task should be priority for the CRC. Department of cannabis, promoting tourism and increasing public awareness of the CRC were cited as viable options. VC Sage commented on public awareness and outreach of the CRC is a priority. Commissioner Grant and Millhouse agreed, Millhouse added tourism is important. Commissioner Harvey agreed as well. Chair Walker stated there is not much support for establishing a Department of Cannabis and made a motion that public awareness, outreach, increased participation and raising the*

public profile of the CRC as the priority subcommittee topic. Motion is seconded by Commissioner Grant. Vote is taken, Millhouse Aye, Sage Aye, Harvey Aye, Grant Aye, Walker Aye unanimously passes. CRC establishes a committee staffed by Sage, Grant, Walker and possibly Millhouse, Harvey declines.

3. Discussion and vote to move CRC meeting frequency to quarterly instead of monthly – Chair Walker prefers to continue meeting monthly, Sage agrees. No option is taken to vote.

4. Discussion on what is required to establish a standalone City department for the administration and regulation of cannabis businesses. - Sage asks staff to explain the power limitation of the Commission and how the purpose of the commission can be changed. Staff refers Commissioners to the bylaws for details on the purpose and the history of establishment of the CRC. Staff reminds the Commission that the body was created through a ballot measure and to change the purpose of the CRC would require a subsequent ballot measure. Chair Walker asked if meeting with City officials to establish a new ballot measure is an option. Staff informed the commission elected officials are the best resource for proposing a ballot measure. Staff relays options for either dissolving or modifying the current CRC from the City Attorney.

5. Discuss and vote to request a Brown Act Training /Q&A session with the City Attorney – VC Sage request to separate the two items. Commissioners agree a Brown Act Training currently is not necessary. Commissioners discuss option to meet with the City Attorney for advice, staff informs the Commission that the City Attorney would not be available to meet for an open Q&A session but can provide trainings. Chair walker asked if a training is available on proposing a ballot measure or working with Council. Staff stated they would ask if that were an option.

6. Implementation Update on State Grants

City staff review charts and graphs included in the agenda packet. Staff informed the Commission that there is delay in disbursing grant because of a new grant making process implemented by the financial department. The Commission would like to support equity by producing a letter to the City Administrator request a revision back the prior grant process for equity grants. Chair Walker made a motion to create a subcommittee to make recommendations to the City Administrator to change the grant making process. Seconded by Sage, motion passes unanimously. Staff will clarify if there are any rules for a joint letter from the CRC. Commissioner Harvey asked for an update of items grant related over the past 8 months, Staff updated the Commission.

Chair Walker will discuss updates report and recommendations regarding raising our public profile and increasing public participation in our meetings.

ITEM C (3) Recommendations for Letter to City Administrator Regarding Grant Making Process

City staff will share recommendations for presenting a letter to the City Administrator regarding the current encumbrance grant making process recently adopted by the City.

ITEM C (4) Trainings Available to the CRC from the City Attorney's Office

City staff will share what trainings are available to the Commission.

ITEM C (5) Business Tax Wavier Incentive & Cannabis Businesses

City staff will inform the Commission if cannabis businesses are eligible for the business tax waiver benefit proposed on the June 2 election.

ITEM C (6) Implementation Update on State Grants

Oakland’s pioneering race and equity analysis of the cannabis industry and creation of an Equity Program inspired jurisdictions across the country to pursue and support similar programs. Then starting in 2019 the State of California set aside annual grant funding to support local jurisdictions’ cannabis equity programs. **Table A** outlines the amount of funding the City has received from the State of California for its Equity Program, Oakland’s ranking among local jurisdictions each year, and the total amount of funding set aside by the State of California that year.

Figure F-2: Graph of Current Active Applications with an Address:

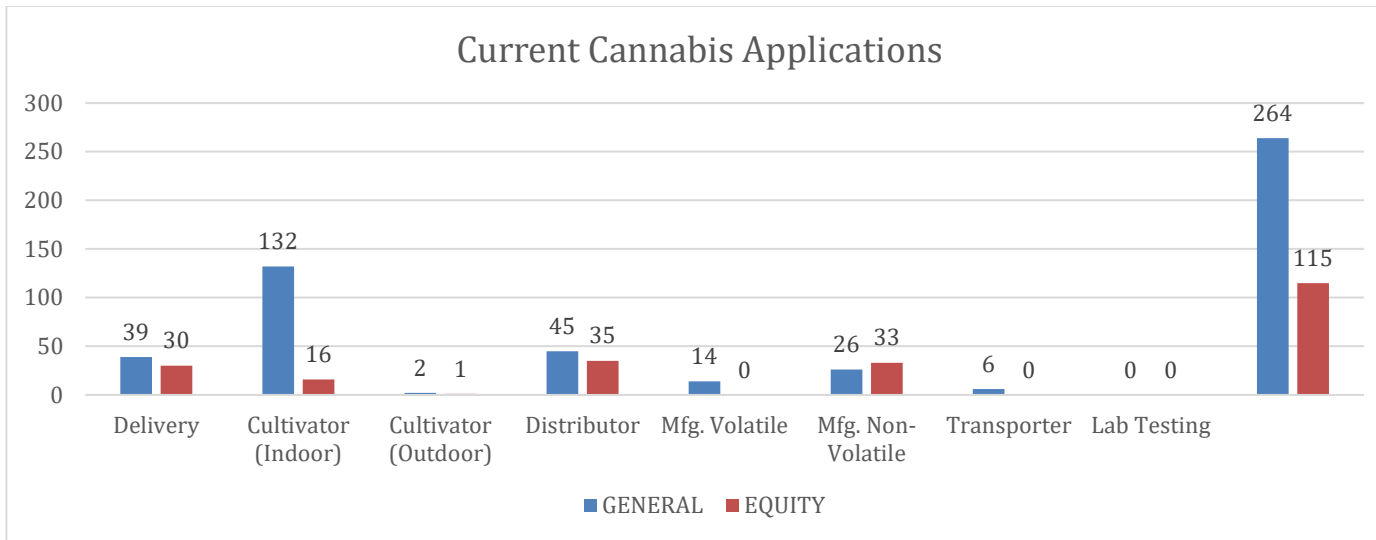
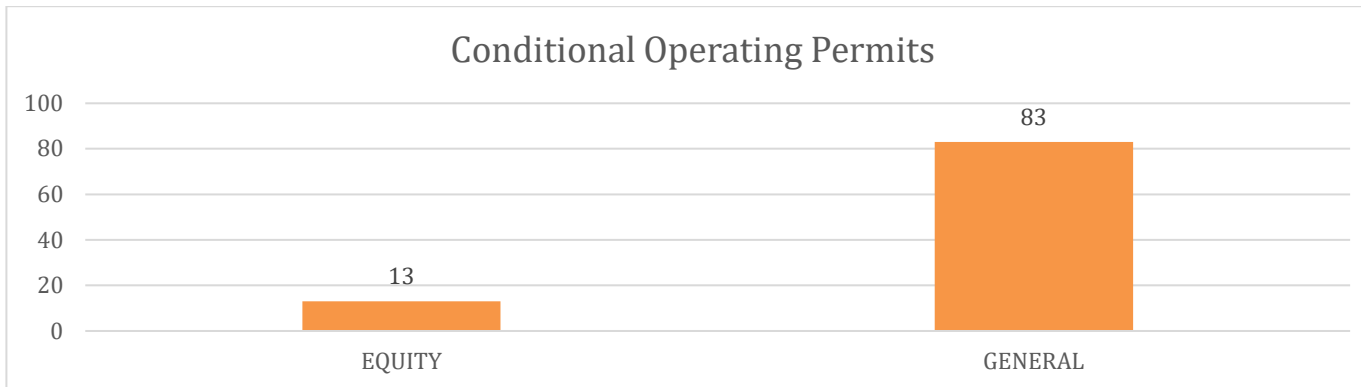
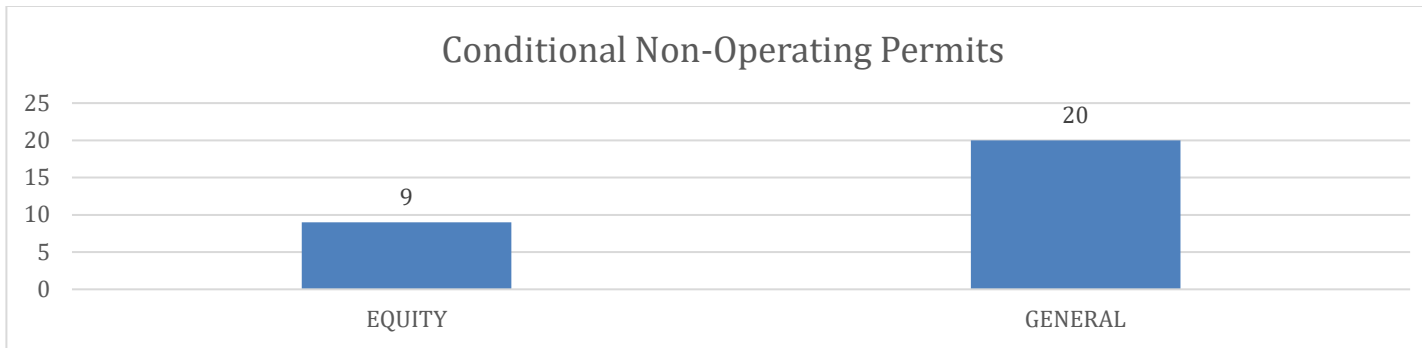


Figure F-3: Conditional Operating Permits



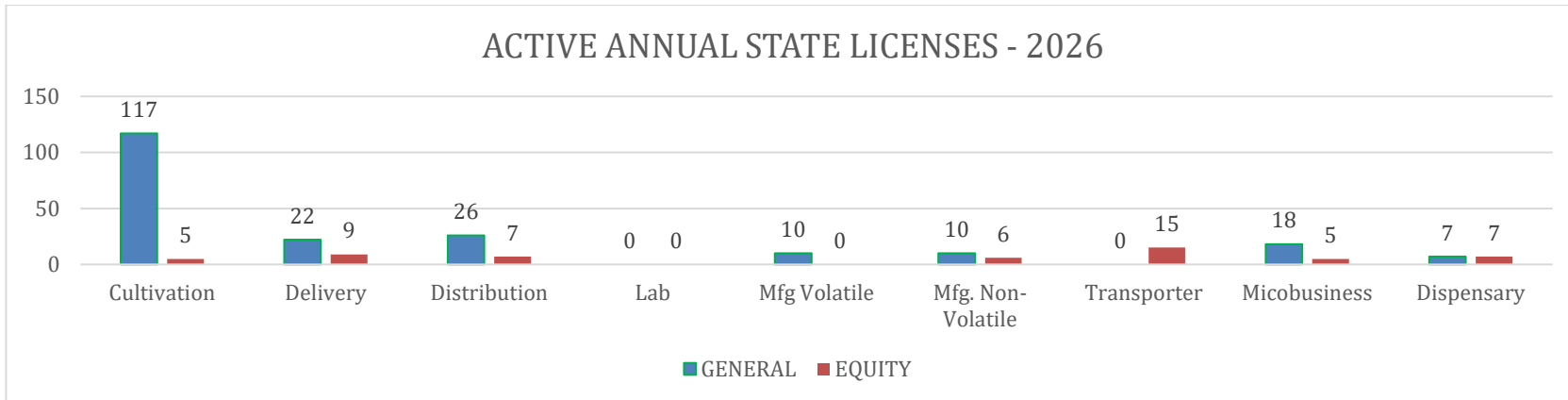

- Many cultivation applicants have multiple licenses with the state to accommodate their canopy size.

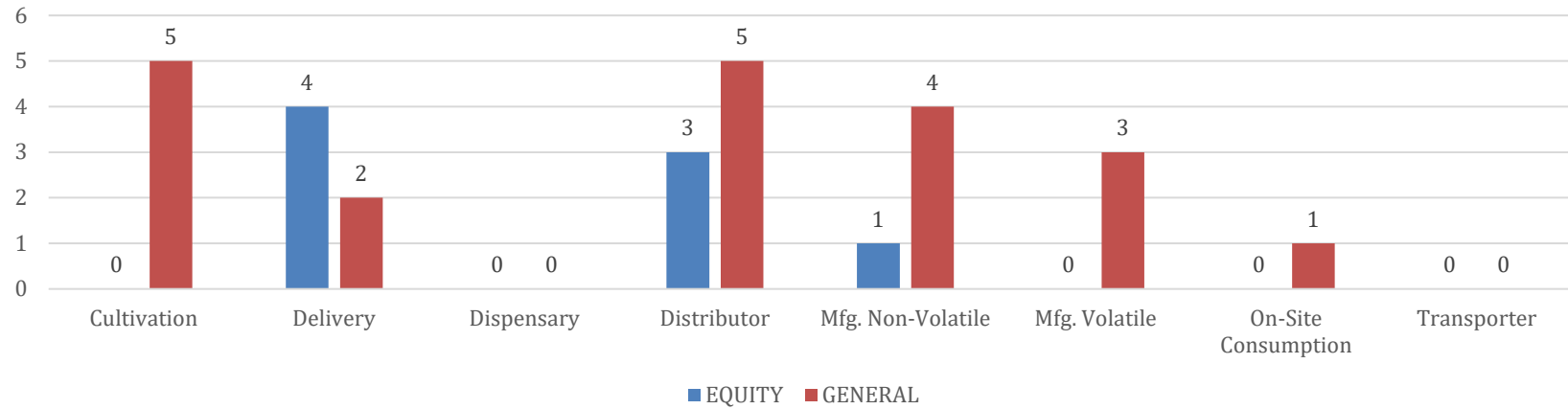
Figure F-7: City Annual Permits Issued (2025-2026)
